Environment Institute of Australia (EIANZ) and New Zealand and New Zealand Association for Impact Assessment (NZAIA)

Memorandum of Understanding on Benefits and Responsibilities

EIANZ and NZAIA, through friendly discussions and exchanges, have reached the following Memorandum of Understanding that establishes the mutual benefits and responsibilities between the two parties.

Background

EIANZ is the leading professional body in Australia and New Zealand for environmental practitioners. It is a non-profit, politically independent professional association. Founded in 1987, the Institute is multi-disciplinary in membership and provides scope and opportunity for professional and academic interchanges across all sectors of the diverse environmental industry.

The mission of EIANZ is to connect and support environmental practitioners to promote a sustainable future.

EIANZ has established a Special Interest Section on Impact Assessment (SIS-IA). The aim of the SIS-IA is to seek to achieve good environmental outcomes by:

- I. promoting ethical and competent practice of impact assessment by environmental practitioners through developing tools, competencies and a certification process; and
- II. developing and promoting within the wider community practices which support or extend impact assessment in terms of institutional and decision-making frameworks, processes, standards, competencies and tools.

The purpose of the NZAIA is to promote the use, and better practice, of impact assessment. NZAIA is an affiliate of the International Association for Impact Assessment. The objectives of the NZAIA are:

- I. To promote the practice of impact assessment (including social and environmental assessment) in the formulation and implementation of development and policy proposals.

- II. To promote research and consultation practices which identify the full social and environmental effects of policies & projects and the measures required to address these.
- III. To promote the development of impact assessment theory and methods.
- IV. To promote impact assessment that recognises and accommodates different social and cultural values, including those of indigenous peoples.
- V. To promote and encourage a high standard of practice amongst members of the Association and others using impact assessment methods, in accordance with the Code of Ethics.
- VI. To recognise and consider the Treaty of Waitangi.
- VII. To undertake or encourage initiatives, consistent with the other objects, powers and resources of the Association, to promote or advance the protection of the environment.

EIANZ and the NZAIA share a common objective to promote the application of impact assessment in decision-making. Both organisations are also committed to the development of the impact assessment field for the benefit of their members, the profession, and to contribute to achieving sustainable development.

Details of Cooperation

NZAIA and EIANZ agree to jointly

- Promote and enhance the quality of impact assessment
- Promote academic research and professional training in impact assessment
- Encourage participation in NZAIA and EIANZ conferences and activities
- Explore ways to encourage our members to exchange their views, ideas, and experience related to impact assessment using relevant social media and other tools
- Provide hot links to each other's websites
- Exchange information on their respective work programs and identify opportunities for collaboration, including for promoting improved impact assessment in the South Pacific
- Negotiate, maintain and regularly review a list of events where members of each organisation can participate at reduced rates.

Obligations of Both Parties

EIANZ will:

- Allow NZAIA members to participate in selected EIANZ events at reduced rates
- Allow NZAIA members to become members of the EIANZ SIS-IA with the same rights as EIANZ members
- Encourage New Zealand based EIANZ members working in impact assessment to join NZAIA
- Promote NZAIA events through its networks and newsletters
- Designate a coordinator for exchange of information between EIANZ and

NZAIA

- Send relevant information on EIANZ activities and news to the designated NZAIA coordinator

NZAIA will:

- Allow EIANZ members to participate in selected NZAIA events at reduced rates
- Encourage NZAIA members to become members of the EIANZ SIS-IA
- Promote relevant EIANZ events through its networks and newsletters
- Designate a coordinator for exchange of information between EIANZ and NZAIA
- Send relevant information on NZAIA activities and news to the designated EIANZ coordinator.

NZAIA and EIANZ are not responsible for each other's operating structure and activities; each organisation operates separately and independently. Neither organisation is responsible or liable for the actions or activities of the other.

Neither NZAIA nor EIANZ are empowered to make statement regarding professional policies or related pronouncement on behalf of each other without prior agreement.

This MoU shall continue for five years. It may be cancelled or renegotiated by either party, by giving the other party one month's written notice of such cancellation or revision.
