

## Treasurer's Report to NZAIA AGM for the 2022 calendar year.

It is my pleasure to report to the members on the state of the finances for the New Zealand Association for Impact Assessment Incorporated. Please note that for financial reporting purposes our statements are for the 2022 calendar year.

Over two days of 30 November - 1 December 2022 we welcomed 68 participants to Te Papa, Wellington for our NZAIA annual conference on wellbeing, sustainability and impact assessment. We were able to provide scholarships for 4 students to attend. The annual conference makes up a significant proportion of our organisational income and expenditure. While still modest, our 2022 conference was our largest in several years and this is reflected in our financial statement.

The number of membership subscriptions increased by 23% on the previous year, reflecting the increased organisational visibility that our conferences generate. Membership subscriptions have been retained at the same fee since 2018, with standard memberships being \$50, and student and low-income memberships at \$20. All NZAIA members have paid their annual subscription fees. Invoicing of subscription fees was undertaken at the end of April to remain consistent with previous year's invoicing. This annual routine of invoicing subscriptions has helped to improve the reliability of NZAIA subscription funds.

As with previous years, we have continued to reinvest approximately \$5,000 plus interest in BNZ term deposits to keep our reserve funds in good order.
