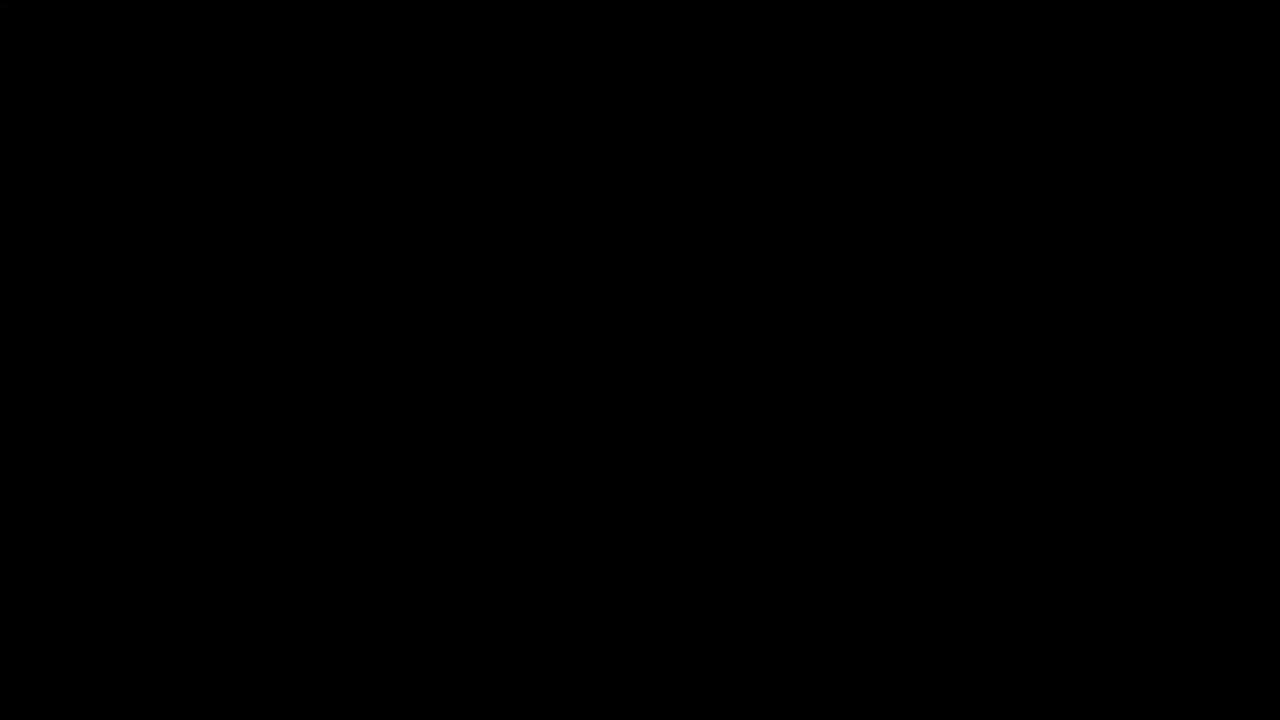



We will be data-driven to demonstrate impact and outcomes.


We will offer critical thinking, leadership, advocacy, and insight into region-wide conversations.

The framework provides a clear line of sight between what we do, what we invest in, and why we consider each component of the framework in every decision we make.


He Tohu Ora — Our people, whānau and communities of Tairāwhiti are able to live the lives we value in ways that matter to us.

Situation or Issue

Tairāwhiti suffers from one of the highest rates of swimming fatalities per capita in Aotearoa.



Activity

Our program will help to ensure future generations have the skills to utilize these activities safely as we introduce students to aquatic principals at an early age.

Priority on low decile students that would otherwise miss out. We believe that everyone should have the opportunity to improve and learn aquatic skills.

2023 will have over 3200 primary school students from 41 schools involved in our program.



Outputs


Sub-domain: Life Expectancy
